Research Your Career Options

Explore Postsecondary Education

Based on your favorite occupations, begin exploring appropriate technical, two-year, and four-year postsecondary education options using the **Select a College** and **Choose a Major** menu tabs.

Create an Education Plan

Use the **Education Planner** to develop or refine a four-year high school plan that will put you on the right path for future education and work in your selected cluster(s) and pathways.

Review the Planning Timeline

Continue to check the **Planning Timeline** to make sure you are on track with important education and career events.

Document Experiences using the Note Taker

Document your career exploration activities by keeping appropriate notes and documents. The **Note Taker** feature allows you to keep this information in one place.

Find Financial Aid and Scholarship Opportunities

Start researching financial aid and scholarship information using the **Find Financial Aid** menu option. Check with your guidance counselor to learn about local scholarships.

Build a Resumé and Plan for Job Interviews
